Technology Requirements: NOTE THE CHANGE FROM IPADS ONLY TO BRING YOUR OWN DEVICE

- Home access to WIFI, internet, and printer (students do not have access to a printer on campus)
- iPad or laptop full tech requirements and FAQ for BYOD policy on next page
- Extra device charger in backpack, if needed

All 9th-12th Grade students need the following supplies

- At least one binder filled with loose leaf notebook paper
- Graph paper for all Math and Science classes
- Blue or black and red pens
- #2 Pencils (mechanical or regular)
- 1 pair of earbuds (kept in backpack) for approved use in the classroom per student handbook

- Graphing Calculator TI 84 or 84 Silver Edition ONLY All students enrolled in mathematics or science courses MUST have one of these Texas Instruments graphing calculators. DO NOT purchase higher models; students will not be permitted to use them because of their advanced capabilities.
- Most AP courses also require an AP review book or material (\$15-20). The exact book title and ISBN will
 be distributed once course schedules are set.

BYOD Minimum Device Requirements and FAQ

Q: Will I need to buy my high school student a 'new' computer?

A: Students may bring their personally owned iPads or laptops. See device requirements below.

Q: What are the minimum requirements for devices?

A:

- Minimum 8' Screen Size
- Battery life: at least 6 hours
- 8GB RAM; 256GB hard drive; WiFi 802.11ac or 802.11ax (WiFi 5 or 6)
- Latest operating system for the device
- Wired or wireless headphones/earbuds
- Microphone (integrated)
- Camera (integrated)
- Software capabilities:
 - Updated virus protection
 - Security: Must have a password/passcode (login) to access the device.
- Students choosing an iPad or other tablet: the device must be no more than 3 years old at the beginning of the year.

Q: Are there any other recommendations for my device?

A:

- Device tracking Apple's "Find My", LoJack, Tile, etc.
- Extended warranty with accidental damage coverage, if available.
- External hard drive/flash drive for backing up files or cloud storage Google Workspace allows unlimited cloud storage for our students.
- Additional AC power adapter (if you want one for school and one for home).
- There's no need to purchase Microsoft Office. Your student can download it from Office.com using their LCCS username and password.
- We strongly recommend all students have a case or sleeve to protect their device.

Q: What happens if my student's battery dies?

A: Students are required to bring their devices to school fully charged. We will do our best to accommodate students who need to sit close to a plug temporarily, provided they bring their own charger. The school will not have chargers available.

Q: Can you provide examples of devices?

A:

- Dell Latitude laptop (Windows 11 recommended)
- Apple Macbook Air or Pro (latest operating system recommended)
- Microsoft Surface Pro or Surface Laptop (Windows 11 recommended)
- 9th or 10th Generation iPad or iPad Pro
- Any Chromebook that meets the above minimum requirements

Q: Will technical support be provided for my device?

A: The family is solely responsible for the repair, maintenance, and updating of the device. The school's technology department will help students connect the device to the school's wireless network.

Q: Is there specific software that needs to be installed?

A: Students will need access to a fully functional web browser.

Q: Is the device required to have an Internet filter?

A: We do not require students to have a filter installed on their own device. Parents may choose to install Internet filtering software, although the Tech Department will not troubleshoot it. While at school, personally-owned devices will connect through the same content filter as all school-owned computers. If using a VPN, it will need to be disabled during the school day, and hot-spotting from phones is not allowed.
